



Bruce Rigal has been Global Chief Operating Officer of Deutsche Bank's ("DB") Human Resources Division since September 2012. He is a member of the Global Operating Committee and the Human Resources Management Committee.

From August 2011 until August 2012 he was the Distinguished Executive in Residence at the University of Chicago's Booth School of Business on their London campus. He held this position while on a one year sabbatical from DB. His responsibilities included: coaching students and alumni on their careers, helping build alumni, corporate, and other external relationships, coaching students in the Global New Venture Challenge and Entrepreneurial Strategy courses, helping develop and implement Booth's Executive Leadership Program, and liaising with the School's global strategy committee.

From 2010 to 2011 Bruce was Deputy Chief Operating Officer of the Corporate and Investment Bank. From 2004 to 2010 Bruce was Chief Operating Officer of Global Banking at DB. The businesses comprising Global Banking had more than 8,000 employees in 37 countries. The business covered: Asset Finance and Leasing, Cash Management, Commercial Real Estate, Debt and Equity Capital Markets, Lending, Leveraged Finance, Mergers & Acquisitions, Trade Finance and Trust Services. Bruce was responsible for the world-wide operations of Global Banking and was involved in planning, human resources, performance measurement and compensation, cost management, communications and marketing, and infrastructure. He was a member of the Global Banking Executive Committee, the DB Group Operations Committee, the DB Group Asset and Liability Management Committee and the UK Regional Governance Board. He Chaired the DB UK People Committee and was senior mentor to the DB Women in European Business Group. Prior to 2004 Bruce was COO of Global Corporate Finance.

Bruce first joined DB in 1995 in Equity Capital Markets focusing on Central and Eastern Europe. He advised on many notable transactions including the IPOs of Infonet in 1999 and Mobile Telesystems, Russia's leading mobile phone company, in 2000.

From 1999 to 2000 Bruce was a founder and Chief Financial Officer of Syntek Capital - an Italian/German venture capital company with investments in the TMT sector.

Prior to joining Deutsche Bank, Bruce worked in the Equity Capital Markets department of S.G. Warburg, and was a management consultant for Oliver, Wyman and Company in New York. Prior to business school Bruce worked in the Treasury Department of Canadian Utilities Limited in Edmonton, Canada.

Bruce received an MBA from the University of Chicago in 1989 and a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Alberta in 1984. He is past Co-Chairman and current member of the Europe, Middle East and Africa Advisory Board of the University of Chicago's Booth School of Business and is a member of the Advisory Board of the Ruppin Center in Israel. He is a founding member of the UK Advisory Board of Facing History and Ourselves and is a member of the Advisory Board of Sapphire Partners in London.
